Jerram Barrs is Professor of Christian Studies and Contemporary Culture and Resident Scholar of the Francis A. Schaeffer Institute at Covenant Seminary in St. Louis. He is the author of numerous books including *The Heart of Evangelism*, *Shepherds and Sheep, Who are the Peacemakers?* and *The Great Rescue*. He also co-authored *Being Human* with Ranald Macaulay. After meeting at Swiss L'Abri, Jerram and his wife Vicki spent several years working at English L'Abri. They have three grown sons.

Hans Bayer was born and raised in Germany. He is the department chair and Professor of New Testament Studies at Covenant Theological Seminary. He also directs the Th.M. program. He is a member of the Fellowship of Evangelical European Theologians, Tyndale Fellowship, the Society of Biblical Literature, the Evangelical Theological Society and a Fellow at the Institute for Biblical Research. Dr. Bayer has been on many teaching trips to the Ukraine, Latvia, Hungary, Germany, Austria, and Brazil. He is married to Susan and they have three children.

Sarah Dryer graduated from Cornell University with a BA in psychology and is completing work for an MA in Communication and Culture from Trinity International University. She began working at the Rochester L'Abri last year while writing her thesis on the ministry of L'Abri.

Andrew Fellows is Canadian, but has spent most of his life in England. Andrew is the director of English L'Abri where for the last 13 years he has lived with his wife Helen and their four children. Before joining L'Abri, Andrew worked as a pastor in the north of England where he and Helen opened their home to the student community.

Ranald Macaulay read Law at Cambridge University, where he met the Schaeffers. He then left his studies to work with L'Abri in Switzerland. He and his wife Susan returned to the UK in 1964 and started the English branch of L'Abri in Greatham. In 2001 Ranald spearheaded the restoration of the historic Round Church in Cambridge which was built in 1130, and established the Christian Heritage charity, of which he is presently the coordinator.

Denis and Margie Haack are the founders of Ransom Fellowship, a non-profit ministry which seeks to train people in the skills of discernment by applying the truths of God's Word to the issues of family, vocation, culture and daily life. Denis is the editor of *Critique* newsletter, and Margie writes *Notes from Toad Hall*, a newsletter reflecting on daily life from a biblical perspective. Denis and Margie have three grown children.

John Mason Hodges is a conductor, writer, lecturer, and composer. He and his wife Day and their son, Mason, live in Memphis, TN. John is now the Director of Music for Second Presbyterian Church, supervising the department of music, conducting adult choirs and composing music.

L'Abri believes that Christianity speaks to all aspects of life, and L'Abri conferences provide lectures, discussions and personal interaction on a variety of ethical and cultural issues.
